- 1040 National Maritime Day participants gather at Navy Pier's Wave Wall to get ready for the ceremony. Recreational boats are invited to form a line and hold at Dime Pier Slip. Boats to monitor VHF Ch. 68 for future communications.
- 1100 National Maritime Day Ceremony near Navy Pier's Wave Wall, located on the South Dock under the ferris wheel.
- U.S. Navy Band and a Color Guard to Post Colors
 - National Anthem
 - Introduction by Capt. Tom Blakely, President Chicago Lodge 3 of ISMA
 - Invocation by chaplain
 - Presidential Proclamation read by a representative from Maritime Administration
 - Remarks by CDR Randy Preston, USCG-MSU Chicago
 - Remarks by Navy Pier
 - Closing remarks by Capt. Tom Blakely
- 1120 Wreath is blessed and US Navy Band and Color Guard proceed to Shoreline Vessel with others in ceremony.
- 1125 Shoreline vessel departs dock and proceeds to fairway.
- 1130 Wreath is laid in the water and vessels salute with horns/whistles
- 1140 USCG, CFD, CPD, and other government vessels lead parade of boats past the stern of Cap Streeter vessel for blessing
- 1150 Cap Streeter returns to its berth at Navy Pier, ending the event.
